Join us in this world where harpsichords play Lil Nas X, where wine barrels and kegs bring life to the party, and where weddings turn into rebellions. Bride fights groom, daughter fights father, and tradition fights novelty during the quest for authentic happily ever afters!

Director Luciana Silvestre Fernandes holds a Master of Fine arts in Directing from University of British Columbia and a Theatre Studies and English degree from Dalhousie University. Luciana joined Neptune Theatre in 2018-19 for the Chrysalis project as a Director and is now working with 2b theatre as their emerging artist in residency.

Luciana's work focuses on reclaiming classical and canonized materials and embracing marginalized perspectives. She has staged several Elizabethan/Jacobean tragedies with a contemporary sensitivity, developing techniques to create expressionistic movement adaptations of classical text. She is now starting Maenad's Theatre: a company dedicated to the creation of inclusive new works.
